Fifty years ago, in 1963, the storied **Studebaker Company introduced the stylish and iconic Avanti**. Ironically, at the end of the very same year, Studebaker closed its South Bend, Indiana, plant, foreshadowing the demise of the 114-year-old nameplate in 1966.


