

Learn to dance the one-step and soak up the history of ragtime as played by Taslimah Bey, John Remmers, Bill Meyer, "Perfessor" Bill Edwards and others. Join us Saturday evening for a live concert where you'll hear the popular tunes of the era performed by the River Raisin Ragtime Revue, and close the day on Saturday and Sunday with a Dixieland-style parade down Main Street led by the Tartarsauce Traditional Jazz Band.


