Explore the newly interpreted *Driving America* exhibition in Henry Ford Museum, including its technology-based interactive kiosks, to learn how the automobile changed the way we live in America. Get inspired by the stories of aviation's early pioneers in the museum's *Heroes of the Sky* exhibit or stand in awe of the mighty power and presence of the 1941 Allegheny Steam Locomotive. In Greenfield Village, experience historic modes of transportation, including a horse-drawn omnibus, a steam-powered locomotive and the Model T.

And learning doesn't have to begin or end with a field trip. Review the Transportation in America educational programs or online teaching tools such as the Educator DigiKits for pre- and post-visit supplemental resources.
