

In this 63rd year of the Old Car Festival, we celebrate the 150th anniversary of Henry Ford's birth with a special gathering of Ford "letter" cars. Letter designations began in 1903 with the Model A, but as the early years of the company progressed, not every letter made it off the drawing board. By the time the Model T was launched in the fall of 1908, the Ford Motor Company had hit its stride. The Model T lived on for nearly 20 years and for a time was the best-selling car in the world. Change was overdue, and in October 1927 there was a fresh start with a reborn Ford, the 1928 Model A. The Model B would follow in 1932 and would usher in the era of significant yearly model changes that continues today.
