- ★ **ICE**  
We WILL have ice available for cost at \$2 per 7lbs bag. Ice will be available during CHECK-IN hours **ONLY**.

- ★ **Civil War Resource Center (Village Pavilion):** Special Exhibits and Presentations ~ Researching Your Civil War Ancestor, The Army & Navy Expedition, Details of Dress for the CW Civilian, original flag staff eagles, the Observance Day poem "The Last Camp", Loomis Battery exhibit, Michigan CW artifacts from The Henry Ford and more on display. This is an excellent opportunity to see originals from the era we represent and portray. The Village Pavilion is open *Saturday, 12 noon-7 p.m.; Sunday and Monday, 11 a.m.-5 p.m.*
- ★ **VILLAGE HOURS & GATE ACCESS:**  
9:30 AM – 9:00 PM (Saturday) ~ 9:30 AM – 5:00 PM (Sunday & Monday). **The BLUE GATE closes at 12:30AM** unless there is a wedding. The Eagle Gate closes much earlier. Please plan accordingly.
- ★ **COMMANDER/REPRESENTATIVE MEETING ~ 9:00 AM**  
We will hold a commander/unit representative meeting each morning promptly at 9:00AM at the Swiss Chalet Break Area. Please send your unit representative and/or commander to this meeting.
- ★ **FIRING MUSKETS & VILLAGE GREEN**  
Do NOT fire muskets on the Village Green during drills – **ONLY** during the Commemoration Ceremony on Monday are muskets to be fired on the Village Green.
- ★ **CHURCH SERVICE ~ SUNDAY ~ 9:30am**  
Impromptu service held at the Martha Mary Chapel – this is a reenactor sanctioned activity and details should be discussed within the groups.
- ★ **STRAW, FIREWOOD AND FIRES**  
Straw will be delivered to the following areas: *Washington Boulevard and Junction Street, Washington Boulevard and State Street, Washington Boulevard and Main Street* for the Civilian Camps and on *Maple Lane* near McGuffey Birthplace for CS Camp and *Maple Lane and Christie Street* for US camp. At the end of the weekend, please clean up your immediate campsite. Douse your fire and replace any sod you removed. Plastic garbage bags will be provided for you to bag up any leftover straw. PLEASE take unused wood back to the woodpile. Gather your trash in bags and leave it near any trash container or take it with you.
