The Henry Ford continues to acknowledge the Civil War Sesquicentennial years through new programs and exhibits as well as bolstered *Civil War Remembrance* offerings. ★ **CIVIL WAR RESOURCE CENTER (Village Pavilion):** Sat (12:00pm – 7:00pm) Sun & Mon (11:00am – 5:00pm)
We will once again be offering special exhibits, researching expertise, presentations, access to view original collections and interaction with historians and material culture experts from around the country. We STRONGLY encourage all participants to visit the Village Pavilion as this is a very unique and rare opportunity to view the originals, interact with these top-notch and nationally recognized historians/experts and listen to the presentations. Additionally, we will have Jack C. Mason, Michigan author, present and book sign "*Until Antietam: The Life and Letters of Major General Israel B. Richardson, U.S. Army.*" Dr. Scott Stabler from Grand Valley State will speak on General O.O. Howard. Matt Switlik will share his Loomis' Battery exhibit, including Gun #23, the original 10-pounder Parrot rifled cannon that belonged to the First Michigan Light Artillery, Battery A ("Loomis' Battery") and captured by Confederates on September 19, 1863 during the Battle of Chickamauga. Civil War Artifacts from the collections of The Henry Ford (Village Pavilion)

Each year, The Henry Ford will display a few select Civil War items from the collection. We will once again display the original poem, entitled "The Last Camp", that was written by J. Wesley Benedict of Port Huron, Michigan in 1872 that was recited at a grand Memorial Day observation in 1894.

This year we will also have a Michigan Civil War Soldiers theme. Artifacts and stories from the collections of The Henry Ford include photographs of Henry Ford's uncles, John and Barney Litogot, of the 24th Michigan Volunteer Infantry; the sword of Captain Joshua Slayton of the 13th Michigan Infantry; and an 1889 oil painting of the Michigan Cavalry Brigade Monument at Gettysburg.

Robert Hendershot, Drummer Boy of the Rappahannock (Village Pavilion)

See the ornate jacket Robert Hendershot wore when he played his military drum at veteran events in the 1880s and 1890s. This Civil War veteran used his savvy promotional skills to garner fame as the legendary, brave "Drummer Boy of the Rappahannock." This item on loan to THF for this weekend.

★ **FASHION SHOW AND CIVIL WAR ERA SHEET MUSIC DISPLAY**

Once again, material culture historian Beth Turza will conduct period fashion shows at the Town Hall stage Saturday 12 noon & 4pm and Sunday at 12:30pm. Inside Town Hall will be extensive display of CW era sheet music. Town Hall will be open during the same hours as the Village Pavilion – see program.
