R. Buckminster Fuller's all-aluminum house was conceived as the home of the future in the 1920s for its affordability and environmentally conscious design.

Located in *Heroes of the Sky*

This 1939 plane revolutionized global aviation while logging more than 12 million miles in nine and a half years!



Kennedy Presidential Limousine

Located in *Presidential Vehicles*

The 1963 assassination of President Kennedy in this limousine represented a pivotal moment in our nation's history as Americans were consumed by shock, a sense of loss and fear for the future.



Douglas Auto Drive-In Theatre
