Welcome to the 64th Annual Old Car Festival

The longest-running antique car show in the country

This Old Car Festival weekend, take in the spectacle as the streets and grounds of Greenfield Village fill with the sights, sounds and smells of hundreds of authentic vehicles from the 1880s through 1932. Enjoy a self-guided tour through this fabulous exposition, and talk to proud owners about their treasured vehicles. Watch drivers engage in games of skill, see a Model T assembled in just minutes, attend fascinating presentations, and sit back and enjoy our experts sharing “car talks” while vintage vehicles pass by.

In this 64th year of the Old Car Festival, we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the famed Dodge Brothers automobile company, a nameplate still alive and well here in Detroit. Founded by brothers Horace Elgin and John Francis Dodge, this company began as a parts and assemblies (axles, engines and transmissions) supplier for a number of different Detroit automakers in 1900. Among their early customers were the Olds Motor Vehicle Company and the Ford Motor Company. The Dodges began building their own automobiles in 1915 (first off the line in the fall of 1914) and trucks in 1917. The new four-cylinder Dodge Model 30 was the main competition for Ford’s Model T and by 1916 ranked second in U.S. auto sales. Both brothers died rather suddenly in 1920. The company was sold to Dillon, Read & Company in 1925, then to Walter Chrysler in 1928. By 1930, Dodge was lifted to No. 2 in the Chrysler lineup, which consisted of Chrysler, Dodge, DeSoto and Plymouth. With DeSoto and Plymouth long gone, Dodge remains a mainstay for Fiat Chrysler Automobiles today.
