Eat, Play, Dance!

Come back to the time when ragtime filled the streets of America. This signature Greenfield Village event focuses on the ragtime era of the early 20th century and brings to life an African-American musical form that came to define American culture and led the way for the Jazz Age of the 1920s, the boogie-woogie/swing style of the 1930s and '40s, and the rock and roll of the 1950s and '60s and beyond.

Immerse yourself in weekend festivities as Main Street bursts with music, dance, marvelous food and morning-to-night fun. Learn to dance the one-step and soak up the history of ragtime as played by Taslimah Bey, John Remmers, Bill Meyer, "Perfessor" Bill Edwards and others. Join us Saturday evening for a live concert where you'll hear the popular tunes of the era performed by the River Raisin Ragtime Revue, and close the day on Saturday and Sunday with a Dixieland-style parade down Main Street led by the Tartarsauce Traditional Jazz Band.
