★ **National Park Service Reverberations Program 8:45pm Saturday – Village Green NEW FOR 2014**

To commemorate the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of General Grant's Overland Campaign of 1864, The Henry Ford has partnered with the Fredericksburg & Spotsylvania County National Military Park for a special tribute. To mark those events, The Henry Ford will be taking part in *Reverberations*, an innovative program put together by the National Park Service connecting three national parks in Virginia and eight communities around the country to illustrate the devastating impact of the Civil War on communities across the country. A special ceremony with Chief Historian and Chief of Interpretation John Hennessey, will be simultaneously streamed live across the internet with these other locations on Saturday, May 24 at 8:45 pm on the Village Green. All CWR participants are asked to participate. Civilians should carry candle lanterns – details will follow from your commander and unit representative. All participants should be in place and ready to go near Logan County Courthouse/Doctor Howard's office by 8:35pm Saturday.
